GEOTHERMAL HOT SPRINGS



Before recorded history began, humans and primates sought out naturally hot bodies of water that get their heat from beneath the Earth's surface.

ANCIENT EGYPTIAN CALDERAS



Ancient Egyptians began bathing as a form of hot water therapy in calderas. They even built irrigation channels to keep a steady supply of hot water.

ANCIENT ROMAN BATHHOUSES



05 Time Period: 200 BG

Hot water treatment in the form of bathhouses became a socio-cultural staple in the Roman Empire. They were heated with furnaces beneath the floors of the baths.

THERMAL SPRINGS OF BADEN-BADEN

egion: Baden-Baden, Germany 07



Roman troops discovered thermal springs in Baden-Baden along the Black Forest and built bathhouses in the area. Remains are preserved in local museums.

THE IKARIA SPAS



The city of Therma discovered hot springs that emanated from the rocks and used them as natural spas, later building their own spas around town.

A NEW PERSPECTIVE ON HEALTH



Greek philosopher Hippocrates proposed a health regimen which included bathing in mineral water with essential oils, perspiration, walking, and massages.

MODERN-DAY CITY OF BATH

Region: Bath, England 06 Time Period: 76 AD



The Romans built the first Water Spa in what is now the city of Bath in England during their occupation of the region, originally calling it Aquae Sulis.

THE CHURCH'S VIEW

Region: Constantinople, Turkey 08



The Church of the Byzantine Empire begins to view bathing in bathhouses as a prelude to sin, thus denouncing the practice of mixed bathing and recreational bathing.

HUANGSHAN SPRINGS

Region: Anhui, China



Time Period: 618 AD

Established during the Tang Dynasty, the highest springs on Huangshan Mountain (650m) are known for its stunning snow-covered landscape during the winter.

TURKISH BATHS (HAMMAM)



The Ottoman Empire built hammams to follow religious rules of cleanliness and purification. Eras later, Victorian Turkish baths were used therapeutically

FIRST NATIONS SWEATLODGES

Region: North America 13 Time Period: 1700s



Along with bathing in springs, sweat rituals with prayers and songs was a spiritual practice for First Nations across North America, especially in the Canadian prairies.

THE BEGINNING OF BALNEOTHERAPY



The studies of mineral waters as medical aid for specific diseases and ailments started to be taken seriously. Steam box baths became a popular method of treatment

WILHELM WINTERNITZ



Wilhelm Winternitz was a Jewish-Austrian surgeonturned-researcher who legitimized hydrotherapy as a rational method of therapeutics in modern medicine.

AMERICAN BACKYARD SOAKER TUBS

Region: California, USA



Ofuro-style tubs made from old wine vats became popular in the US. The repurposed barrels were leaky and were quickly replaced with purpose-built cedar tubs.

FIBREGLASS & ACRYLIC SPAS



Wooden tubs started being replaced by fibreglass and acrylic models for a more durable, leak-resistant mould that integrated hydro-pumps in the form.

ONSENS & OFUROS



The Japanese engaged in outdoor bathing in hot springs called onsens. After its popularity increased, they started building tubs indoors and called them of uros

THERAPEUTIC REDISCOVERY



Bathing culture experienced a wave of scientific re-evaluation, and its popularity as a recreational pass-time spread throughout Europe during the Renaissance era.

LAKE HÉVÍZ

Region: Héviz, Hungary 14 Time Period: 1795



Lake Hévíz is the largest swimmable thermal spring in the world. Landowner Count György I. Festetics saw the lake's potential and built a bathhouse directly overtop.

NEEDLE BATH SHOWER



Also known as the ribcage shower, this particular model from L. Wolffe Manufacturing Co. has curved pipes that surround the body, spraying pressurized jets of water.

FDR & SARATOGA SPRINGS

Region: Saratoga, New York USA 18



32nd US president, Franklin Roosevelt, established Saratoga State Park to preserve the area's naturally carbonated mineral springs and geyser created by the Ramapo Fault Line.

INVENTION OF THE HYDROTHERAPY PUMP

Region: Irvine, California USA 20



A portable pump meant to be added to the home bathtub was invented in response to a child's physical ailments. It later went into production as a public product.

The successful endeavor to sell luxurious, Canadianbuilt hot tubs began in the February of 1978, leading to 45 years of high quality, industry leading hot tubs.


